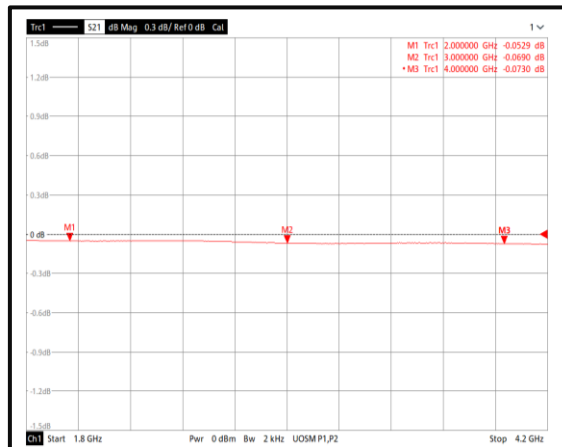

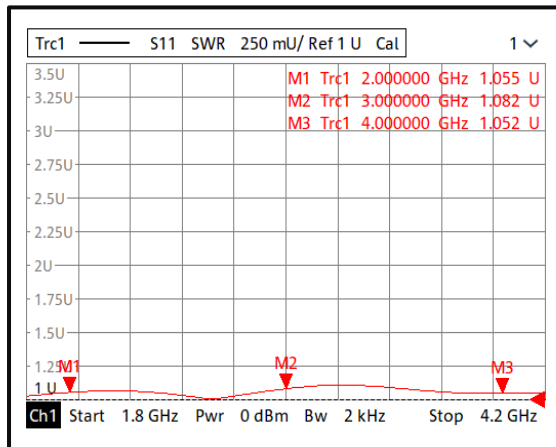

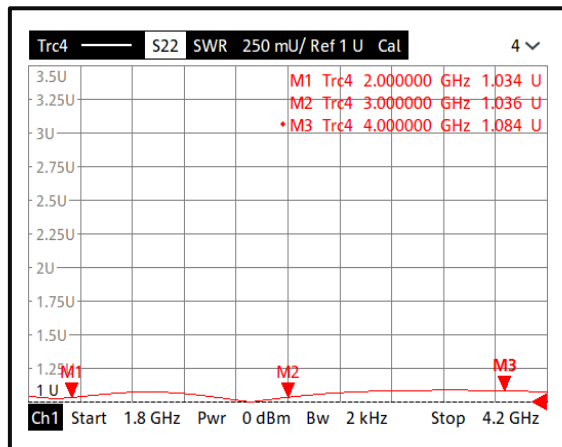
Insertion Loss



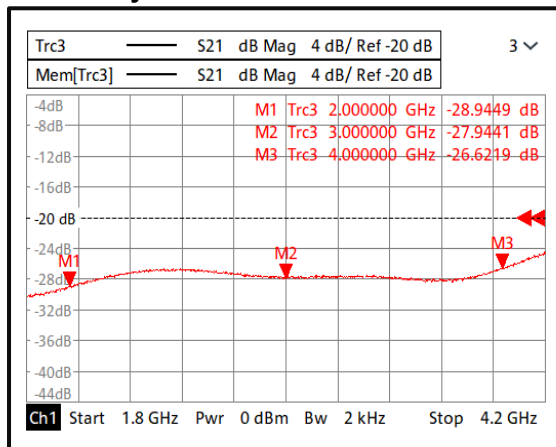
Primary VSWR



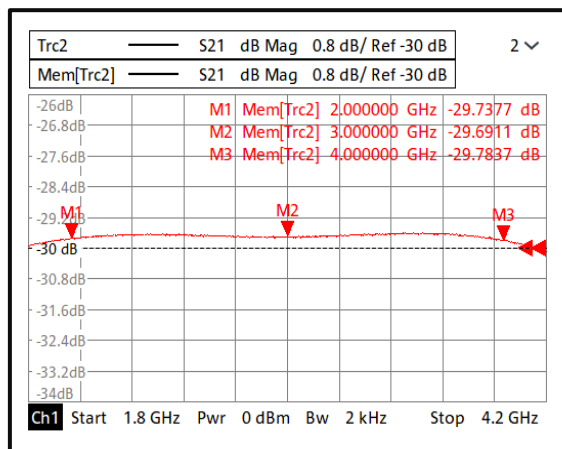
Secondary VSWR



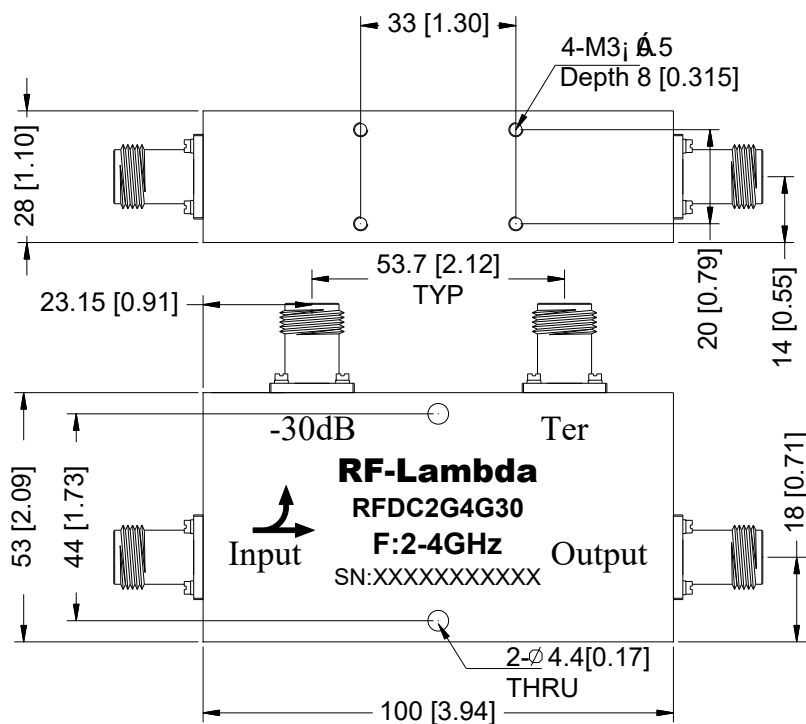
Directivity



Nominal Coupling

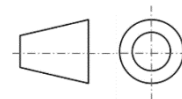
